### FINDING YOUR WAY THROUGH THE SERVICE

**Open Communion:** From whatever tradition you come and wherever you are in your journey of faith, you are welcome at our table. You will find simple directions on how to participate in the worship bulletin.

**Prayer ministers** are always available at the back of the church during communion at the 10:00 a.m. service for anyone who has a prayer concern. Bring your heartfelt burdens, thanksgivings or intercessions and we will pray with you and for you. Strict confidentiality observed. See page 5 of the worship bulletin for more information.

**Hearing Devices** are available. Our ushers will be happy to assist you and provide simple instructions.

**Hymn Singing:** The hymn numbers are listed to the far right and on the pillars to the front of the church. The Hymnal is the red book located in the pew rack in front of you.

**Reading the Lessons:** You may enjoy simply listening to the readings as Christians did for centuries before the printing press was invented. If you would like to follow the scripture readings, Bibles are available at the back of the church. The Book of Common Prayer is the black book in the rack and is the principal book of liturgy for Episcopalians.

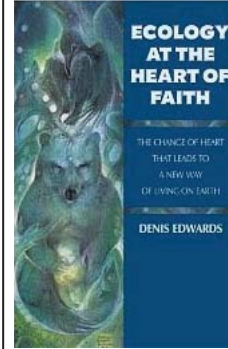

### BUILDING COMMITTEE ACTIVITIES

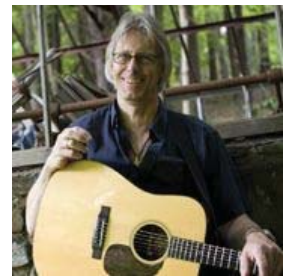
**SANCTUARY WALL LEAK** –The exterior work has been completed and tested. Success! Within the next week, the exterior scaffolding will be removed. Concurrently, the interior scaffolding will be re-installed so that the plaster and paint work can be accomplished. With a little luck, everything will be finished by the end of July.

**UTILITY WORK** – In the upcoming week, the work will begin. There will be a trench dug between the church building and the church school building. The Micheltorena Street side of the Trinity property will be fenced off to allow for staging and storage of excavated earth. The drain and utility lines will be replaced. The trench will be filled and the walkway repaired. This work also should be finished by or near the end of July. Some inconvenience will be unavoidable but the contractor will do everything possible to maintain access points for our use.

**KITCHEN REMODEL** –The construction plans have been submitted to the City Planning and County Health Departments for approvals. Feedback has been positive and it is judged reasonable to expect to be able to pull permits in early August. In the meantime, the process for selection of a general contractor has been underway. Proposals have been received and interviews will take place in the next week. The Building Committee expects to make a general contractor recommendation to Vestry for the meeting on the 21st of July. The contractor will then entertain subcontract bids and, working together with the Building Committee, get a total project budget together for Vestry approval in the first week or two of August. The Committee is committed to doing everything possible to ensure the completion of the project in as timely a fashion as is possible.
