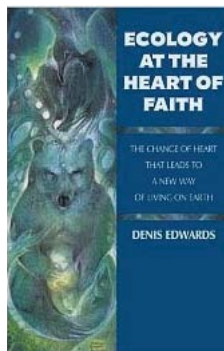

building update

The Building Committee and Construction Oversight Committee have been busy the past few months. The Building Committee meets monthly and the Construction Oversight Committee has begun meeting weekly to address immediate issues arising around the various projects that have been underway.

It looks like the leak in the sanctuary wall has finally been successfully repaired. It required finding and obtaining a special mortar which caused some delay. However, the exterior work has been completed and successfully tested. The exterior scaffolding has been removed and the interior scaffolding has been re-installed. The interior plaster and paint work will now be repaired. With a little luck, everything will be finished by the end of July.

The work on the Utility Project began on Monday, the 19th of July. A trench is being dug between the church building and the church school building. The Micheltorena Street side of the Trinity property has been fenced off to allow for staging and storage of excavated earth. The drain and utility lines will be replaced. The trench will be filled and the walkway repaired. This work also should be finished in early August. Some inconvenience is unavoidable but the contractor is doing everything possible to maintain access points for parishioner's use.

The kitchen remodel will be underway very soon. The construction plans have been submitted to the City Planning and County Health Departments for approvals. Feedback has been positive. It is judged reasonable to expect to be able to pull permits within the next week or two. In the meantime, the process for selection of a general contractor has been underway. In the mid-July the Construction Oversight Committee conducted interviews with the five general contractors who responded to the Request For Proposal (RFP) solicitation. The COC reached a consensus to make a recommendation to the full Building Committee at the meeting on the 20th. The Building Committee will make a general contractor recommendation to Vestry for the meeting on the 21st of July. With Vestry approval, the selected contractor will entertain subcontract bids and, working together with the Building Committee, get a total project budget together for Vestry approval by no later than the regularly scheduled August meeting. Child Abuse and Adult Misconduct Prevention Training

Are you a Catechist, Youth Mentors, Church School volunteer, Children & Youth Council member, member of the Pastoral Care team or someone who is thinking about engaging in any of these ministries? We are holding a "Safeguarding God's People" training on Saturday, August 28th, 2010 from 8:30a.m. – 1:00p.m. here at Trinity. This training is required by the Diocese of Los Angeles of all clergy and employees of our congregations, schools and institutions, and volunteers with responsibility for children and vulnerable adults. The training must be renewed every five years and covers things such as:

- signs of child abuse and abuse between adults
- mandated reporting laws
- sexual harassment
- policies of the diocese with regards to abuse and sexual harassment
- current workplace laws

If you are a member (or a possible member-to-be) of any of those above-mentioned groups, please sign up for our training. Further, in order to promote awareness among all members of our churches, vestries, bishop's committees and other leadership entities, such as Parish Council, are encouraged to participate in the training.

Many of you may have had this kind of training for your current jobs. HOWEVER, the diocese is requiring that all listed above receive this specific Safeguarding training.

If you are not able to make it to this training, we will require that you attend a training session elsewhere in the diocese before January 1, 2011.
