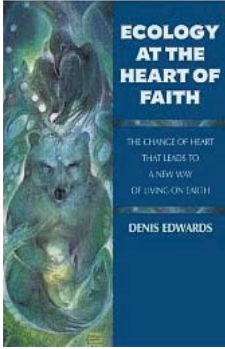

Child Abuse and Adult Misconduct Prevention Training



Are you a Catechist, Youth Mentors, Church School volunteer, Children & Youth Council member, member of the Pastoral Care team or someone who is thinking about engaging in any of these ministries? **We are holding a “Safeguarding God’s People” training on Saturday, August 28th, 2010 from 8:30a.m.–1:00 p.m.** here at Trinity. This training is required by the Diocese of Los Angeles of all clergy and employees of our congregations, schools and institutions, and volunteers with responsibility for children and vulnerable

adults. The training must be renewed every five years and covers things such as:

- signs of child abuse and abuse between adults
- mandated reporting laws
- sexual harassment
- policies of the diocese in regards to abuse and sexual harassment
- current workplace laws

If you are a member (or a possible member-to-be) of any of those above mentioned groups, please sign up for our training. Further, in order to promote awareness among all members of our churches, vestries, bishop’s committees and other leadership entities, such as Parish Council are encouraged to participate in the training.

Many of you may have had this kind of training for your current jobs. **HOWEVER**, the diocese is requiring that all listed above receive this specific Safeguarding training. If you are not able to make it to this training, we will require that you attend a training session elsewhere in the diocese before January 1, 2011.

You must sign-up in advance to participate in this training. The deadline to sign up: August 19th.
