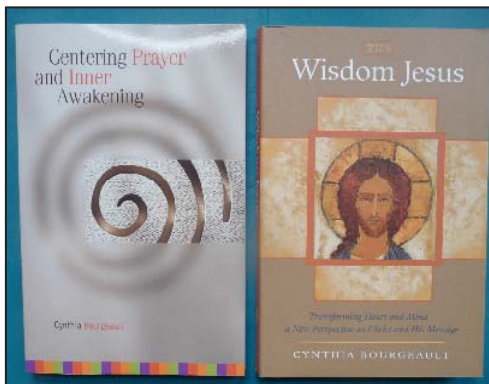

Members of our parish supporting Fonkoze Santa Barbara invite you to join us in our 5K Run/Walk. It takes about one hour walking or 30 minutes running. 100% of profit will support women in our Fonkoze microcredit bank program in Jean Rabel, one of the poorest rural Haitian villages. Since opening in 2009 our bank has provided small loans to over 1,000 poor women. For the last two years we have raised funds for education programs in literacy and business skills. *Now the village of Jean Rabel is faced with caring for 16,000 victims of the Port au Prince earthquake*, relocating to their town. Five Santa Barbara women from our group will be visiting Jean Rabel the first week of October. We plan to bring back to you a first hand account of how our support is opening up new possibilities. WORDS MATTER: Practicing the Politics of Compassion October 1 and 2, 2010 at the University Club

In this two-part seminar, Dr. Borg will address the topic of his forthcoming book "Speaking Christian."
