If you would like to follow the scripture readings, Bibles are available at the back of the church. The Book of Common Prayer is the black book in the rack and is the principal book of liturgy for Episcopalians.

Open Communion: From whatever tradition you come and wherever you are in your journey of faith, you are welcome at our table. You will find simple directions on how to participate in the worship bulletin.

Prayer ministers are always available at the back of the church during communion at the 10:00 a.m. service for anyone who has a prayer concern.
